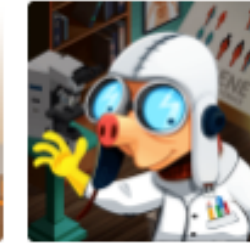
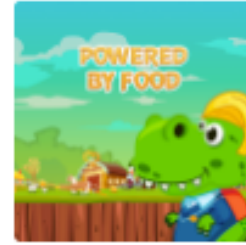
## Main Concepts

- Some changes to abiotic factors in an ecosystem are caused by human activities, such as climate change, deforestation, and pollution.
- Short- and long-term environmental changes to an ecosystem can affect the populations within the ecosystem.
- Secondary succession occurs after an event that damages an established ecosystem.
- Parasitism is a symbiotic relationship in which one species benefits while the other is harmed.
- Mutualism is a symbiotic relationship in which both species benefit.
- Indirect drivers are factors that indirectly affect the function of an ecosystem.
- In predator/prey relationships, predators limit the population of the prey.
- Habitat loss and fragmentation are threats to the biodiversity of an ecosystem.
- Earth's major aquatic ecosystems include: freshwater, estuaries, and marine.
- Different communities live within an ecosystem.
- Competition for resources can occur among organisms of the same species or among different populations within a community.
- Commensalism is a symbiotic relationship in which one species benefits while the other is unaffected.
